What's new in SOR 2.0?

- Programming at Big Brothers, Big Sisters in St. Louis, Cape Girardeau, and Springfield to support youth and families with mentoring and wraparound services, with a focus on African American kids and teens
- Overdose education training, trauma services, and substance use harm reduction services at The T STL, an antiviolence drop-in center in North St. Louis

<u>Treatment</u>

- Funding for private Opioid Treatment Programs to increase access to methadone for those who are uninsured and underinsured
- Program manager at the MO Primary Care Association to work w/ Community Health Centers to increase delivery of evidence-based Substance Use Disorder treatment in primary care settings
- Healthcare Transformation Manager at the MO Coalition for Community Behavioral Healthcare to ensure the state-funded SUD treatment system transitions to a modern, integrated, evidence-based reimbursement model
- Coverage of psychosocial treatment for stimulant use disorder
- Contingency Management approaches at 5-10 treatment sites with high volumes of admissions for stimulant use disorders
- Expanding the Eastern Region Engaging Patients in Care Coordination (EPICC) project to include telemedicine medication inductions and bridge prescriptions post-overdose, and a recovery coach focused on neighborhoods with predominantly African-American residents

<u>Recovery</u>

- Advanced clinical guidance and training videos for peers working in treatment and recovery housing settings
- Funding for Recovery Support Services (RSS) statewide, including care coordination, recovery coaching, and peer-led support groups
